

Health Forward

The Health Forward Foundation awarded a \$25,000.00 grant to the Kansas City, Kansas School Foundation for Excellence in partnership with the ShareWaves Foundation in support of KCKS Public Schools. Sharewaves and KCKS Public Schools have teamed up to implement Ready2Play, virtual physical education classes for middle school students without access to organized winter sports or physical activity due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

As a result of the pandemic, there have been additional barriers to student access to sports. With the lack of sports and physical involvement, students miss out on critical structured play, physical health, social-emotional growth, and academic development.
